
Dragons' Den: The Sustainability Project

- How has this environmental issue impacted you personally? (i.e. Boyan Slat and his inspiration)
- What are the impacts of your chosen environmental issue?
 - o Social, economic, environmental, political, health, etc.?

Innovative Solution:

- What is your innovative solution to this issue?
 - o Product/program development
 - Prototype, or
 - Blueprint, or
 - Description of program
- How will this product/program provide for:
 - Environmental sustainability
 - An opportunity for economic globalization
 - Affect people's lives and the environment
- *Ensure you are providing sufficient evidence to support your response

THE PITCH: Success Criteria

Be sure to include the following in your pitch:

- Who you are and your company background
- Industry background, is there a need for your company or room in the industry?
- The problem your company is trying to solve
- The background work that you and/or your company has done
- Company evaluation (be realistic with your numbers)
- What your company plans to do with the money
- Why is it a good business idea
- Provide a visual, prototype or demonstration (depending on your product)
- List the features and benefits
- What needs will this product satisfy for the customer

What makes a good pitch checklist:

- First impression
- Identify the problem you are trying to solve
- Identify how your venture solve that problem uniquely
- Doesn't rely on facts that can be easily debated
- Is it clear
- Is it greed inducing (you should instantly get why it will make money)
